Our mission as a Christian global development organization is to work with communities to increase the standard of living of children, women, and families, through access to education, health, and sustainable income.

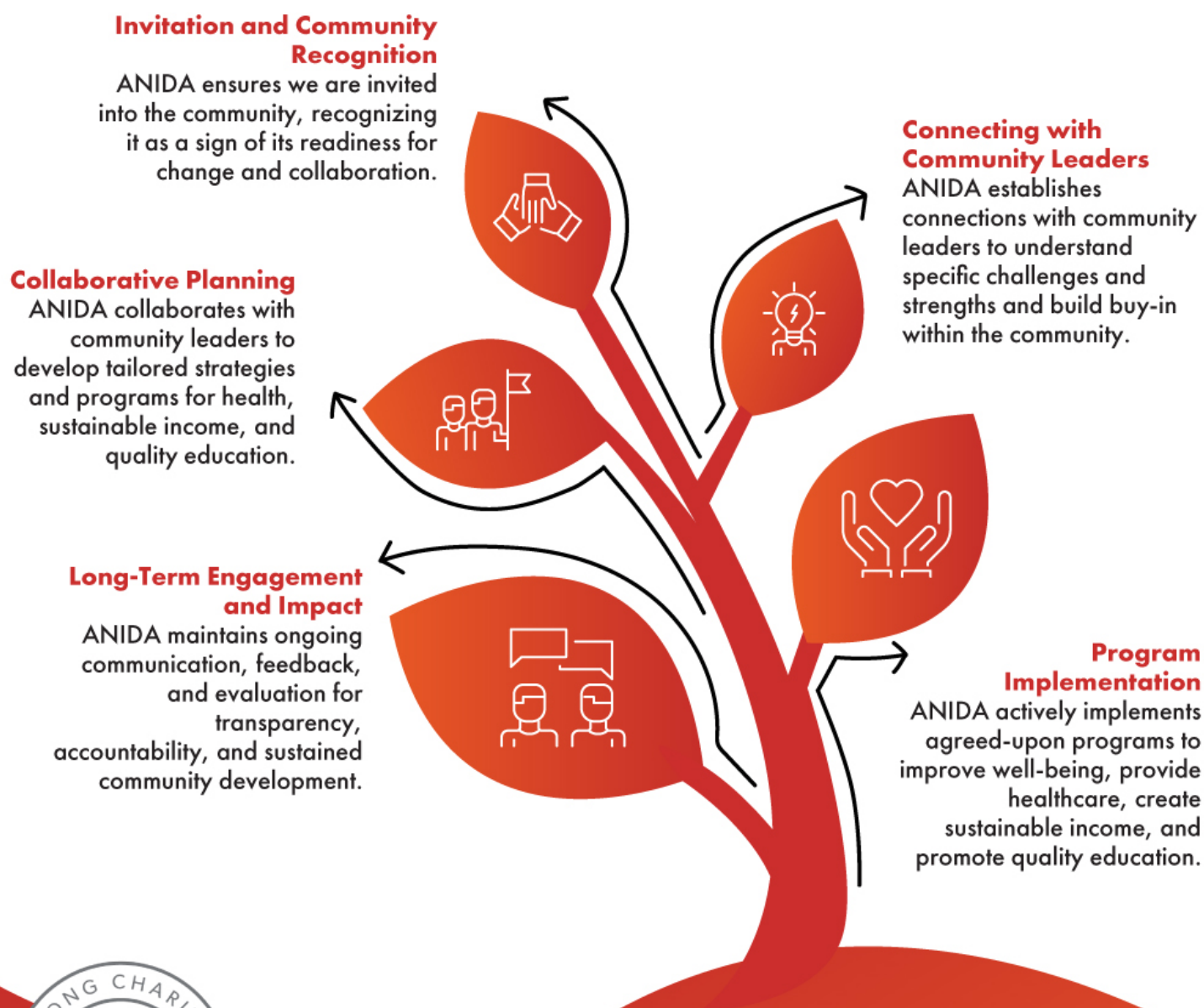

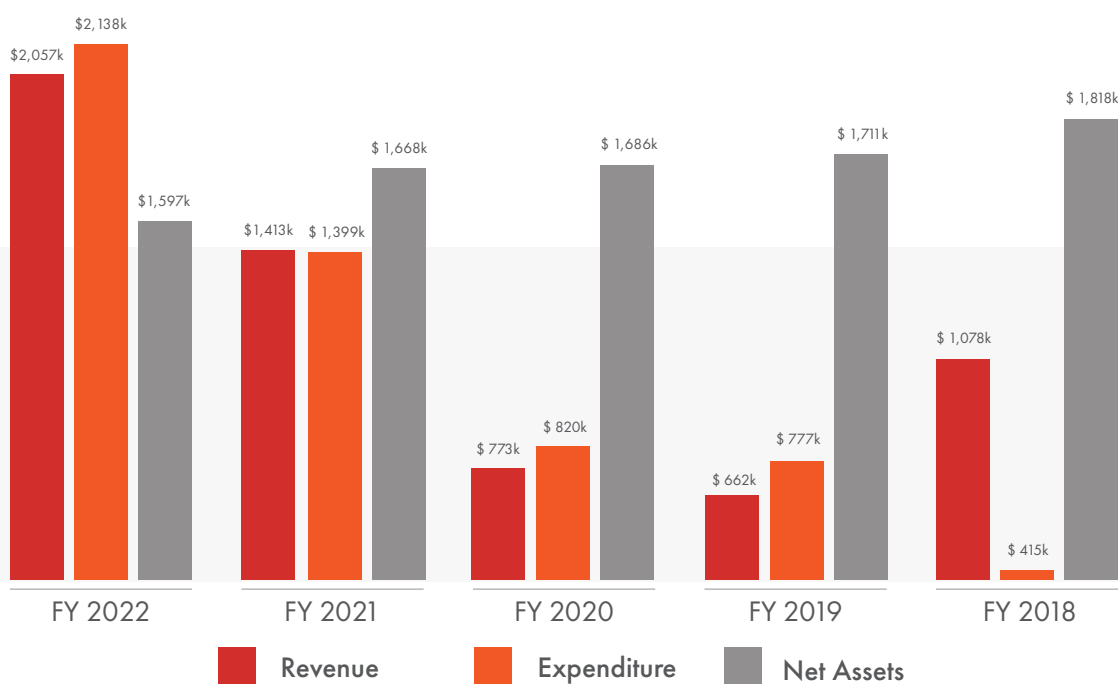


Percentage of Expenditures

04 WHAT WE DO



GHANA

Ghana is located in West Africa with a population of 32.91 million. The capital city is Accra. We serve the communities of Old Asuoyaa, Betom and Akwadum. Ghana is a country in West Africa situated on the coast of the Gulf of Guinea. The first black African country south of the Sahara to achieve its independence from colonial rule. The first ANIDA office was established in Koforidua, Ghana.



ANIDA's Impact in Ghana

Empowering Communities for Sustainable Change: ANIDA's Comprehensive Engagement Approach in Asuoyaa, Betom, and Akuadom

In 2022, ANIDA embarked on a comprehensive engagement process to uplift the communities we serve, including Asuoyaa, Betom, and Akuadom. Through our unwavering commitment to community engagement, collaboration, and leadership, we have focused on empowering individuals and fostering positive change. The dialogue with community leaders has covered a wide range of critical topics, including quality education, sustainable income practices, as well as health and nutrition. Taking these fundamental aspects into consideration is an essential step in the process of creating a sustainable and thriving environment for all. ANIDA's commitment to supporting the communities it serves remains steadfast as we work in partnership with them, resulting in a lasting impact on individual lives and the advancement of society as a whole.

Hope For Tomorrow (HFT)

The Hope for Tomorrow program is doing well and has improved greatly. The quality of life of the children under this program has also improved. The burden of parents or families paying school fees, books, and uniforms for their children has been reduced with the help of this

intervention. Children have graduated from primary school to junior high school, others to high school, and from there to the university. Most Ghanaians value this support more than any other incentive because education is key. Any child that gets the opportunity to go to school has a bright future and will contribute meaningfully to society.

2022 Workshops

Health Talk: Adolescent Reproductive Health

The Health talk was successfully organized and served as an opportunity to educate the children and young adults on the importance of good adolescent health and hygiene. A Community Health Nurse from Ghana Health Service (Magazine Community-Based Health Planning and Services) was the resource person together with two other colleagues. She spoke extensively on who an adolescent is, and the ages that fall under the adolescence period. A lot of illustrations were demonstrated for the children to understand the changes that occur in the body during the adolescent stage and how to manage them. She also spoke about teenage pregnancy and its related consequences. She explained to the children the various sexually transmitted diseases, how it is contracted, and their prevention.

The number of children who participated was about one hundred and twenty (120) with ten (10) parents in attendance.

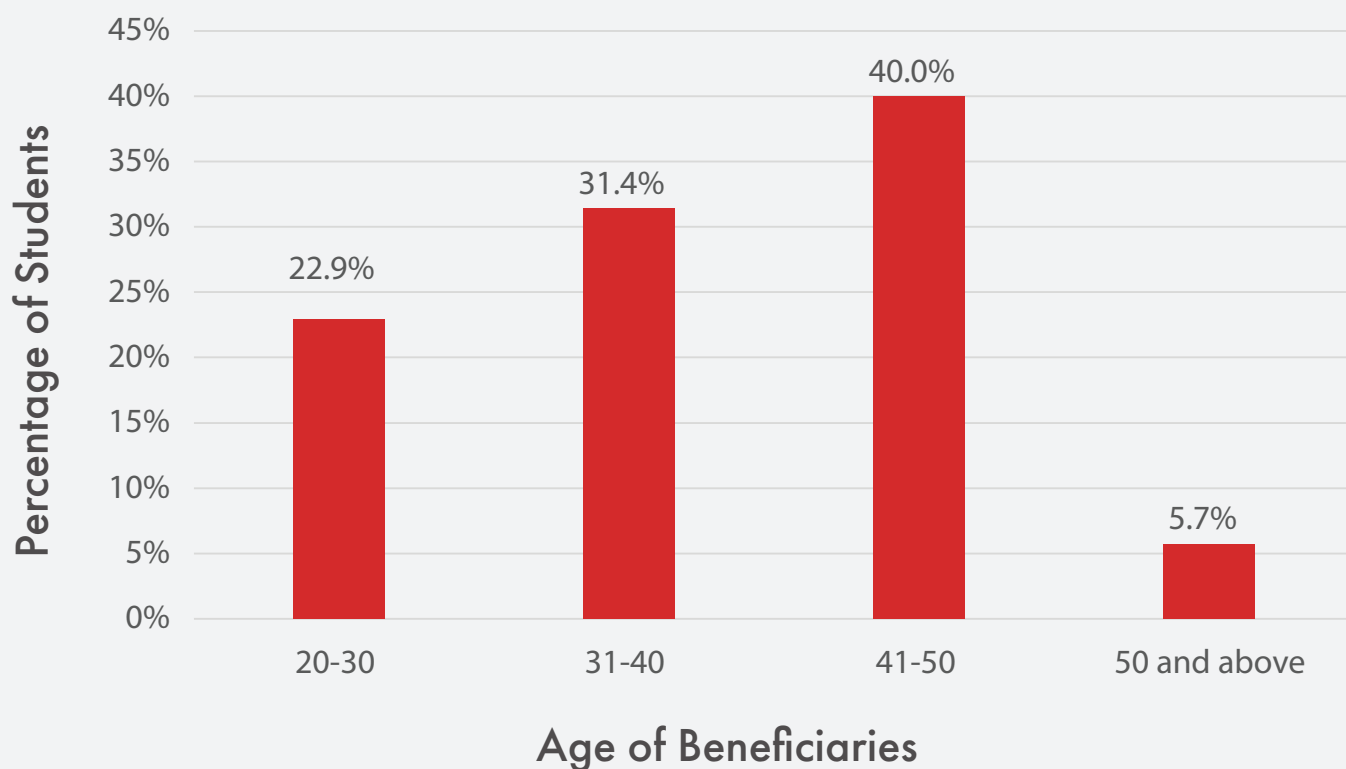


Empowering Women's Development at WDC: Unlocking Skills, Creating Opportunities

WDC Occupational/Entrepreneurial Skills Project

This program is designed to assist those who would not otherwise have been able to get a formal education or learn a trade. By providing our students with practical skills, this course is designed to empower them to be financially independent by generating income to sustain themselves and contribute to their communities. Many women in the Eastern region consider the Women's Development Centre (WDC) to be a beacon of hope. WDC believes that education and vocational training have the power to transform lives and create lasting change.

Enrollment and Achievements:

In 2022, we enrolled 158 new morning students across different levels, with a total of 275 students actively participating in our programs. These individuals represent the driving force behind our efforts to empower women and create sustainable change.



Success Stories:

Our programs' impact is exemplified by our graduates' success stories. Juliana Yeboah, a WDC alumna, is pursuing a fashion course at Koforidua Technical University. As a result of the School of Aesthetics' graduates, approximately 30% have gone on to start their own salons, demonstrating the power of education and skill to bring about a positive change in all aspects of life.



Challenges and future goals:

In addition to celebrating our accomplishments, we acknowledge the challenges we face in the future. Drop-outs remain a concern for various reasons, and we are committed to addressing these issues head-on.

Achievements of WDC Students

Five students from the School of Aesthetics have opened salons where six students from the School of Aesthetics are employed. One student has gathered the confidence to write the National Vocation Training Institute (NVTI) examination in fashion and one has gotten admission to Koforidua Technical University. Three (3) graduates have started trading and they are now able to record all transactions as a result of the teachings in the WDC School of Continuing Education

The Chicken Project: Empowering Women and Children

One Feathered Friend at a Time At ANIDA, our commitment to servant leadership, integrity, community, diversity, and faith shines through in every project we undertake. We are thrilled to share the remarkable impact of our Chicken Project, made possible by the generous support of donors like you.

We started with the purchase of 100 chickens, a small but meaningful step towards empowering these individuals and fostering self-sufficiency. Through the sale of 324 lbs of chicken meat, we were able to generate much-needed funds to support the women

and children in our program. The impact on their lives has been positive, and they now feel more hopeful and confident for the future.

We are now setting our sights on expansion, as we believe that together, we can achieve even greater heights. Obtaining additional land space will allow us to increase our chicken population to a minimum of 400 per cycle, which will enable us to serve a broader community and amplify our impact. Further, this expansion allows us to explore cash crops, further increasing our profitability and sustainability.

Liberia, a country in West Africa with a population of 5.19 million was founded by free people of color from the United States. The emigration of African Americans, both free and recently emancipated, was founded and organized by the American Colonization Society (ACS). Africa's first elected female president is from Liberia. We are currently serving the people in the following communities; Ganta, Sanniquellie, Loguatu, and Gowe-Tonzolomon.

The Hope for Tomorrow (HFT) program of ANIDA in Liberia provides children with the opportunity to receive a quality education and break free from poverty. There has been an impressive sponsorship rate of 98% in Liberia, ensuring that nearly every child in our program receives the support they require. To further strengthen our commitment to these children, we established the ANIDA's Children Parents Association (ACPA), a parent committee dedicated to encouraging and supporting the sponsored children.

To address some families' transportation challenges, we are working to implement a motorcycle or taxi transportation system in collaboration with the ACPA and community leaders. With this initiative, we will ensure that every child can access their education without difficulty, allowing them to excel in the classroom.

Unlocking the Power of Unity: International Day of the African Child

In Liberia, specifically in Nimba County, we are committed to addressing the pressing issues that impede learning outcomes for children. The theme for this year is “Eliminating Harmful Practices Affecting Children: Progress on Policy & Practice since 2013,” which calls upon local and national leaders to take decisive action to protect children’s welfare. Together, we strive to create a society in which harmful practices are no longer allowed to impede the development and growth of children. The mobilization of local communities and raising awareness regarding child safeguarding policies can ensure that every child is protected and has the opportunity to succeed in life. In embracing their cultural heritage and celebrating their potential, it serves as a platform for showcasing our African children’s incredible talents, gifts, and abilities.

We are thrilled to share the outcomes of this impactful event. Communities have united in their commitment to eliminating social and educational injustices. Our collective effort has raised awareness of the importance of honouring the International Day of the African Child, attracting the attention of state actors who have pledged to legislate on eliminating harmful practices affecting children.

Igniting Empowerment: ANIDA’s Farmland Project in Liberia

The Farmland Project is our latest endeavour that emphasizes gender equality awareness and income-generating activities on a community farm in Liberia in an effort to enhance women’s empowerment.

In the vibrant Tonzolomon community of Liberia, ANIDA is working tirelessly to increase the knowledge and skills of local women in farming, boost food production, improve food security, and elevate economic returns for the entire community. Our comprehensive program includes training 100 individuals, focusing on empowering 75 women in commercial farming and processing.

As a result of the generous grant from the Gay Lea Foundation, we have received \$17,950 that will be used for expanding and maximizing the productivity of the existing farm in Tonzolomon. Through this funding, we are able to offer essential training and capacity-building workshops, promote gender equality, and raise awareness of the program’s impact on the local community. Our Liberia Farmland Project has already sprung into action with planting cassava, plantains, eddoes, and potatoes.

Furthermore, we are expanding our poultry and pig farming operations to ensure a diverse and sustainable approach to agriculture. Our dedicated team, initially comprised of 5 individuals, is working diligently to cultivate the land and nurture the farm animals.

As we embark on the next phase of this transformative project, we anticipate expanding our team to hire at least fifty individuals at each stage of the farming process. From brushing, clearing, planting, weeding to harvesting and beyond, we aim to provide employment opportunities to over a hundred families. Investing in their skills and livelihoods fosters economic growth. It empowers vulnerable populations, such as older people, people with disabilities, and women and girls who face disadvantages.



We recognize the need for continuous improvement and sustainability to achieve our goals. We are beginning with acquiring additional land, constructing permanent structures for the birds and pigs, and ensuring optimal nutrition and healthcare. We are adapting our strategies for long-term success by cultivating strong and resilient African breeds, learning from our past experiences, and adapting to changing climate conditions.

The impact of our Farmland Project extends beyond agricultural production. It resonates deeply within the Bain Garr district and Northern Liberia, all within the beautiful Nimba County. We are sowing the seeds of change and nurturing a brighter future for all by providing employment opportunities, enhancing food security, and empowering marginalized communities.

Together, we can unlock the potential of women, uplift communities, and create a sustainable pathway to prosperity. Join us in igniting empowerment and be part of the transformative journey that will empower future generations.

Toronto Area (GTA). Individuals of all ages, interests, and abilities are welcomed into our program, which offers a world of literary exploration and endless possibilities for them.

Indigo Love of Reading Foundation

The Indigo "LOR" partnered with ANIDA to help promote literacy to children and support vulnerable Canadian families through the 2022 Summer Reading Matters program. This partnership was to enable the purchasing of kids' and teen books from Indigo.



Coding Workshop (Hackergal)

Hackergal hosted two hybrid workshops on Thursday, August 11th, 2022 (with coding activities for girls ages 9-14 years of age and 15-18 years of age). We broadcasted hybrid workshops via Zoom Cloud Meeting to girls unable to attend the in-person workshops.

The idea was to expose the children and youth to STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) by collaborating with activity partners and guest speakers. Our goal is to identify and contact potential collaborations, develop, and implement a plan for exposure to STEAM principles and concepts, and track and assess the impact of our program on the participants. We will continue to empower children and youth by building their confidence and sense of belonging in their communities through diverse books that speak to them; introducing young people to STEAM, particularly girls, to fields such as trades and technology; and promote life skills and critical thinking.

ANIDA's future plans in the Philippines are centered around community collaboration, engagement, and leadership development in Kidapawan City. We believe that by actively involving the community in our programs and projects, we can create sustainable and meaningful change. Additionally, we are considering the implementation of the RISE TO RICE Program, a buy-and-sell initiative focused on rice. This program aims to cater to the specific needs of the Kidapawan community, ensuring food security and promoting economic empowerment.

Through these programs and projects, ANIDA aims to empower the community, foster collaboration, and develop leadership skills among its members. We believe that strong leadership, community involvement, and sustainable initiatives are the keys to creating lasting change and improving the lives of children and families in Kidapawan City.
