LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear ANIDA Family,

As we reflect on the transformative impact of our work in 2023, we are filled with pride and gratitude. Our journey has been illuminated by countless stories of hope and resilience, each one a testament to our shared commitment to creating a compassionate and understanding world.

This year, we took a significant step by expanding our reach to a new continent. In the Philippines, we discovered a pressing need for clean water in a village called a Purok. Picture the villagers gathering water from a nearby river, often contaminated and unsafe for consumption. Listening to the heartfelt pleas of local leaders, we initiated a vital water project. By working closely with the community, local leaders, and the local government, we are not just providing clean water; we are bringing hope, health, and a brighter future to countless families. This endeavor, born from community engagement and collaboration, aims to eradicate the scourge of unsanitary water, which has long been a major cause of illness.

Our commitment to improving healthcare access was further demonstrated through our first medical mission in Liberia. Imagine a school property in Ganta transformed into a bustling temporary clinic. People traveled up to two hours, their journeys beginning in the pre-dawn darkness, to reach this site. The air buzzed with anticipation as families, some of whom had camped overnight, waited to receive medical care. Our team, including one pharmacist from the US and local doctors, worked tirelessly. All medications were purchased locally to support the community and ensure their effectiveness. Over the four-day span of the program, we served over 920 Liberians. By 2 AM on the final day, all available tickets were completely out, showcasing the immense need and our dedication to addressing urgent healthcare needs.

The transformative power of education and empowerment is vividly illustrated in the lives of our beneficiaries. Take Sappeh Philip Kwaku, for example. Philip joined our Hope for Tomorrow program as a child in elementary school. After excelling in his studies through secondary school, he earned an ANIDA scholarship to study at university. Today, he is employed with us, completing his National Service. Philip's journey from a young student to a dedicated team member exemplifies the profound impact of our programs.

As we move forward, let us carry the spirit of hope and resilience that defines ANIDA. Our programs are creating leaders across continents. It starts with children confidently taking action in their classes, knowing they will be supported. Women are venturing out and starting their own businesses after completing classes at the Women Development Center. Farmers are working at community farms, earning enough to support their families. Students are becoming the first in their families to earn a university degree. The impact you are making is changing lives and alleviating poverty in a sustainable way.

We extend our heartfelt appreciation to all of you, our ANIDA family, for your unwavering support and dedication to our cause. Together, we are truly changing the world for the better, one person and one community at a time. Whether you are staff, volunteers, donors, or beneficiaries, your role is essential and invaluable. Each of you is a cherished part of the ANIDA family, and we could not achieve our mission without you.




Our Mission Statement







Philip's story with ANIDA starts in 2006, as a young boy facing life without a father. Enrolled in ANIDA's Hope for Tomorrow program, he receives the support he needs to navigate his educational path. The ANIDA program has been supporting him throughout his education, from basic school through junior high, and finally to senior high, making the unlikely a reality.

Raised in a modest home by a single mother struggling to make ends meet, Philip faces numerous challenges. His father left the family, leaving his mother to care for Philip and his four siblings. Despite these hardships, Philip's determination never wavers. In a way, ANIDA's support acts as a guiding light, providing him with a clear view of the future.

Every morning, Philip wakes up before dawn to help his mother with household chores. With his books in a tattered bag, he walks miles to school, fueled by a dream and ANIDA's unwavering support. The program provides not just financial assistance, but also emotional and moral support, encouraging him to strive for excellence.

When financial barriers threaten his dream of tertiary education, ANIDA's Tertiary Scholarship Program comes through. In 2020, Philip begins his studies at All Nations University, pursuing a degree in Business Administration and later specializing in accounting. The ANIDA office becomes his second home, where he not only learns but also contributes, fostering a sense of community and belonging.

"ANIDA brings hope back into my life," Philip reflects. "I will act as a role model for those who have not joined ANIDA." Today, Philip serves his National Service as a Junior Accountant at ANIDA Ghana, a testament to the transformative power of our programs. His journey from a hopeful student to a professional role model exemplifies ANIDA's mission.

A Raymond Larbi Otu Story





ANIDA's Hope for Tomorrow (HFT) program has provided education supplies and self-esteem workshops to sixty-nine students from impoverished families. This support is key to navigating the complex socioeconomic landscape in this community. Our students are now much better equipped to face challenges head-on, armed with the knowledge that they are valuable members of their community and have the tools to succeed. This would not have been possible without the generous support of the Peterborough K.M. Foundation, whose contributions have been instrumental in our efforts to uplift and empower these students.

Women's Empowerment

The Women's Development Center, a program of hope for underprivileged women and girls, offers comprehensive skills training. From vocational skills to leadership development, the center equips these women with the necessary tools to build a better future, fostering empowerment and self-sufficiency.

In 2023, ANIDA's project in Liberia's Tonzolomon community made significant strides in empowering women and fostering sustainable development. The project's impact extended beyond the 75 women directly involved, benefiting the community by enhancing food productivity, strengthening social cohesion, and promoting collective ownership.

Key achievements included expanding a farm from one to 11 acres, generating income through commercial farming, and supplying food and cassava products to the community. Progress also included successful pigpen relocation, poultry development, and farm expansion with African breeds. Training sessions empowered women to challenge gender stereotypes, take on leadership roles, and engage in decision-making. Highlights included innovative land clearing for coal sales, improved livestock monitoring, and increased cassava marketability. Adaptive strategies and diligent monitoring ensured continued progress despite challenges. ANIDA expresses gratitude to the Gay Lea Foundation for its support, which has been instrumental in advancing women's empowerment and sustainable community development in Tonzolomon.

Agricultural Development

ANIDA's agriculture extension project boosts food productivity and economic returns for local communities. Initiatives like cassava cultivation have provided sustenance and economic opportunities for families. Ongoing activities include weeding cassava farms to increase tuber size for better marketability and planting new breeds of plantains and eddoes.

From Vision to Impact: ANIDA's November 2023 Medical Mission in Liberia

In November 2023, ANIDA's medical mission in Liberia marked a pivotal moment in our commitment to global healthcare. Over the course of the mission, our dedicated team of healthcare professionals—comprising clinicians, pharmacists, and dispensers—provided critical medical services to 927 patients in the Royal Community and surrounding areas of Ganta.

Our comprehensive approach included medical, pediatric, OB/GYN, and geriatric consultations, complemented by rapid diagnostic tests, counseling, and outpatient treatments. Despite navigating significant challenges such as limited resources and accessibility to follow-up care, our team's resilience and expertise ensured the delivery of essential healthcare services.

The mission not only addressed immediate health needs but also fostered strengthened relationships with local health authorities and the community. This collaboration enhanced the accessibility of healthcare for residents in dire need, showcasing the profound impact of collective effort and unwavering support from our stakeholders. We also thank Apotex for their support in funding this initiative.

The success of this mission not only improved health outcomes but also reinforces ANIDA's ongoing commitment to supporting and empowering communities in Liberia. As we reflect on these achievements, we are inspired to continue our journey toward better health and well-being for all.

ROOTS OF EMPOWERMENT: CULTIVATING CHANGE IN TONZOLOMON

In the heart of Liberia's lush Tonzolomon community, Maisha, a 34-year-old mother of three, forges a new path. A woman once restricted by traditional roles, which kept her on the margins of subsistence farming, has had her life transformed by the empowerment program of ANIDA, which is supported by the Gay lea Foundation.

Maisha joined other women at the cooperative farm -- a symbol of collective strength and change. In collaboration with ANIDA, she developed farming techniques and leadership capabilities. The training opened new doors, empowering her with knowledge and elevating her role within the community. The project ambitiously expanded a modest one-acre plot into a thriving 11-acre farm. Maisha and her peers managed crops of cassava and plantains, and cared for livestock, applying their newfound expertise.

Statistical Impact: The initiative equipped 75 women with crucial skills, enabling them to improve farm productivity dramatically.

The transformation is evident as women, once spectators, now lead discussions on crop sales and community investments. By becoming key decision-makers, they have not only secured the community's economic and food security but also proved the personal and collective impact of empowerment.

Maisha reflected on the changes, as she surveyed the fields that had flourished under their care. "This land, once bare and challenging, now thrives with life, just like the women who till it... In addition to growing crops, we have also developed strength and confidence among ourselves." There is an energizing effect on the community's spirit.

"We owe a debt of gratitude to the Gaylea Foundation," Maisha acknowledged, recognizing the support that fueled their journey. "Their support has been crucial in turning our dreams into reality, helping us move beyond subsistence to create a sustainable future."

Next Steps for ANIDA

ANIDA aims to further enhance the economic impact of the Tonzolomon community through the acquisition of a cassava processing unit. With this unit, the community will be able to produce Gari, a popular West African food product made from cassava. By processing Gari locally, the community is able to achieve higher market values for their crops, thereby increasing income generation. By investing in this advancement, the community will not only be able to sustain its economic base but will also have more opportunities for growth and stability.

ANIDA seeks continued support to realize this goal, aiming to secure a brighter economic future for Tonzolomon and its resilient inhabitants.





Program Implementation

ANIDA swiftly registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and focused its efforts in critical areas, including Nursery Phase 1- Purok Ponkan, Nursery Phase 11 Purok Nangka, Pendatun St. Extension Purok Tundan, Purok Guava fronting Apo Sandawa Homes, and Habitat Settlement Project in Sudapin. The organization enrolled eighty-six grade school children, providing them with essential school supplies, bags, and uniforms, ensuring access to education for vulnerable children. These efforts have already started to bear fruit, with improved school attendance and academic performance among the enrolled children.

Christmas Treat

In December, ANIDA hosted a heartwarming Christmas Treat for the children in partnership with Balagot and Co. and Jollibee Kidapawan City. The children received additional school supplies, toys, snacks, and Christmas packages, bringing joy and hope during the festive season.




